Let's celebrate the future leaders of our community!

The job market is divided into 16 distinct career clusters and each cluster groups together jobs that have similar functions, skills, or objectives. The 16 Career Clusters are:

- **1. Agriculture, food, and natural resources -** focuses on jobs related to farming, forestry, and fishing. It's all about producing food, wood, plants, and animals.
- **2. Architecture and construction –** focuses on jobs related to designing buildings, constructing roads, and renovating homes.
- **3.** Arts, audio/video technology, and communications focuses on jobs in design, journalism, film, and even performing arts.
- **4. Business management and administration –** focuses on business jobs from managers to administrative assistants.
- **5. Education and training –** focuses on jobs like teaching, coaching, or training.
- **6. Finance –** focuses on jobs in banking, insurance, and financial planning.
- **7. Government and public administration –** focuses on jobs as politicians, civil servants, and diplomats.
- **8. Health Science** focuses on medical jobs from doctors and nurses to lab technicians, this cluster is all about keeping people healthy.
- **9. Hospitality and tourism –** focuses on jobs making people feel welcome, whether they're at a hotel, restaurant, or tourist attraction.
- **10. Human services -** Jobs here focus on helping people, whether it's through counseling, personal care, or community services.
- **11. Information technology –** focuses on jobs in technology. It's about designing software, managing networks, and everything in between.
- **12. Law, public safety, corrections, and security –** Focuses on jobs about keeping people and properties safe. It includes lawyers, police officers, and security guards.
- **13. Manufacturing –** focuses on jobs all about making products, whether it's cars, furniture, or electronics.
- **14. Marketing, sales, and service –** focuses on jobs promoting and selling products or services.
- **15. Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) –** focuses on jobs for innovators and problem-solvers. It includes scientists, engineers, and analysts.
- **16. Transportation, distribution, and logistics** focuses on jobs about moving people and products from one place to another, whether by land, sea, or air.
